**Government Regulatory Agency** denotes working in a governmental agency charged with regulating and enforcing rules and regulations (i.e., FDA, FCC, SEC or FAA). Positions may include examiners, auditors, inspectors, collectors or agents. Annual caseload is determined by the number of investigations conducted. Success is determined by the number of cases won or revenues collected.

**Prosecutor's Office** denotes working within the criminal justice system prosecuting individuals charged with crimes. Positions include municipal attorney's (city), district attorney's (county), attorney generals (state & nation), solicitor generals (planet), advocate generals (Colonial) or prosecutor general (Imperial). Annual caseload is determined by the number of cases prosecuted. Success rate is determined by the conviction rate.

**Public Defender's Office** denotes working as an attorney for the government and defending criminals. Annual caseload is determined by the number of cases defended. Success rate is determined acquittal rate.

**Judiciary** denotes working within the criminal court system. Positions include law clerks, trustees, magistrates, judges (trial courts) and justices or tribunes (appellate courts). Annual caseload is determined by the number of cases tried. Success is determined by the number of cases upheld by the appellate courts.

**Political Office** denotes either appointment or election to a public office. Positions include municipal office (city council or mayor), county office (supervisor or commissioner), state (state assembly or governor), nation (member of the national legislature, cabinet secretary or head of state), planet (council of nations or secretary general), colonial (colonial presidium or Imperial Representative) or Imperial (Imperial Senator (Imperial Moot) or Imperial Minister). Annual caseload is determined by the number of bills passed. Success is determined by popular vote.

**Law Firm** denotes working as a lawyer in a smaller private practice or larger law firm representing a variety of individuals and organizations performing civil and criminal court proceedings. Positions include associates, partners or senior partners within a law firm. Annual caseload is determined by the number billable hours. Success is determined by the number of acquittals or settlements.

**Civil Rights Organization** denotes working with a private organization who brings lawsuits against governments or corporations who violate constitutional law. It may also provide criminal or civil defense to clients that are prosecuted. These organizations often accept cases on a pro bono basis. Examples of such organizations are the ACLU and various legal aid societies. Positions include legal advocates or law guardians. Annual caseload is determined by the number of billable hours. Success is determined by the number of cases won or settled.

**Corporate Counsel** denotes working for a megacorporation. Positions include associate counsels, or general counsels. Annual caseload is determined by the number of billable hours. Success is determined by the number of cases won or settled.

**Political Consultant** denotes working in a political lobby group (political party, labor union, trade group or bar association). Annual caseload is determined by the number of billable hours. Success is determined by the number of major clients brought in.

**Law School** denotes teaching in a law school. Positions include instructor, associate professor, professor, department chairperson and dean of the law school. Annual caseload is determined by the number of classes taught. Success is determined by popularity.

## **Political Office**

Politicians can be elected, appointed, inherit, or in some cases, purchase their way into office depending upon the society and its' form of government.

**Lower Office** equates to lower level (city, county or state) political officials such as delegate, trustee, representative, counsel, negotiator, ombudsman, alderman, councilman, counsel, analyst, selectman, coordinator, advocate, examiner, auditor, referee, associate, appointee, apprentice, attaché, intern, special assistant and political aid.

**Middle Office** equates to middle level (nation or planet) political officials such attorney general, minister, commissioner, superintendent, administrator, secretary, controller, treasurer, director, commissar, chairman, consul, senator, chief of staff, squire, seneschal, cardinal, emissary, ambassador, professor and adjutant.

**High Office** equates to the highest level (Colonial or Imperial) of political officials such as mayor, governor, president, secretary general or minister.
