

Criminal Investigative Agency (CIA)

CIA employs hundreds of thousands of full-time plain-clothes agents charged with investigating crimes against federal and international law. It has field offices in most major planetary cities. Its mandate is the investigation of criminal activities by using joint taskforces exploring violent crimes such as murder of government employees or bank robbery, narcotics (drug trafficking or narco-terrorism), computer crimes (computer fraud or trafficking in child porn), treasury crimes (forgery or counterfeiting), organized crimes (racketeering or money laundering) and civil rights crimes (slavery or laborsteering). It may operate a variety of specialized unit such as surveillance teams, counter-intelligence teams, counter-terrorist units, a legal attaché program (assigned to overseas embassies and consulates), a behavioral science unit, along with a national criminal forensics laboratory and national computer network with an extensive criminal database. Its agents have bachelor degrees and are trained at the CIA Academy. Best examples: US Federal Bureau of Investigation, US Secret Service, New Scotland Yards.
